




in mustard yellow, one of the 'it' colors right now.




sizing chart

Chest size (CS): Measure horizontally at the widest point of the bust.

*The sleeve length is the size including the shoulder length.

notions

One 50-g ball of wool contains 90 m of yarn.

- Knitting needles no. 4.5 and 5
- Circular knitting needle no. 4.5
- Darning needle
- Water-soluble stabilizer (e.g. Solufleece 321) or a piece of pattern paper
- Yarns: (Stockholm, Lang Yarns, thickness 4.5-5): see table

swatch

Knit a swatch of 15 x 15 cm using a reverse stocking stitch and no. 5 needles. Measure 10 x 10 cm on your swatch; count 19 st and 23 rows. Use a thinner needle if your swatch is wider and a thicker needle if your swatch is narrower.

Stitches to be used

- **Italian cast-on:** if you are a beginner, check out the YouTube video tutorials on the Italian cast-on
- **1x1 rib stitch:** 1 st p, 1 st k, and repeat. Knit the stitches as they occur in the return row.
- **Reverse stocking stitch:** 1 row p, 1 row k
- **Straight stitch:** embroidering on the knitted garment using a darning needle

knitting instructions



Back

1

Cast on 59/61/63/65/67/69/73/77/81 st using no. 4.5 needles. Use an Italian cast-on or a regular cast-on. Knit 1x1 rib stitch for 5,5/5,5/5,5/6,5/6,5/6,5/6,5/6,5 cm. Start with 1 st p.

2

Continue working a reverse stocking stitch with no. 5 needles. In the first row after the rib, increase 0/0/0/0/0/1/1/1/0 st. You will have a total of 59/61/63/65/67/70/74/78/81 st. Continue working until you reach a height of 25/26/27/28/28/30/32,5/33,5/35 cm. End with a k row.

3

For the armhole, decrease on both sides at the start of the row: first 4 st, then 3 st. You will have 45/47/49/51/53/56/60/64/67 st.

4

Starting from this point, decrease each time at the front of the garment as follows (raglan):

Row 1: 2 st k, slip the 3rd st without knitting, work the 4th st k, bring the 3rd st over the 4th. Purl until 4 st from the end, then 2 st k together, and then 2 st k.

Row 2: 3 st p, then k until 3 st from the end, then 2 st p.

Work these two rows a total of 15/15/16/16/17/18/19/21/22 times. Keep 15/17/17/19/19/20/22/22/23 leftover st. Leave the st on the needle until the front and the sleeves are done.

Front

5

Repeat the previous steps for the front, but only repeat the 2 rows for the raglan 9/10/11/11/12/13/15/16/17 times. End with the 2nd row. You will have 27/27/27/29/29/30/30/32/33 st left over.

6

Repeat the 1st row of the raglan again, but this time, slide the center-most 15/15/15/15/17/18/18/19 st for the neckline onto a stitch holder or yarn. Finish the row. Work the 2nd row of the raglan all the way to the neckline.

7

Knit one side of the neckline first. Turn your piece and decrease 3 st p at the start of the row. Finish the purl row, while you decrease the knit at the end for the raglan. Work back to the neckline. Turn your piece, decrease 1 st, and finish the row. Turn your piece and bind off the last st together. Knit the other side of the neckline.

Sleeves

8

Cast on 31/31/33/33/35/37/39/41/41 st using no. 4.5 needles. Use an Italian cast-on or a regular cast-on. Work 5,5/5,5/5,5/6,5/6,5/6,5/6,5/6,5/6,5 cm 1x1 rib stitch. Start with 1 st p.

9

Continue working a reverse stocking stitch with no. 5 needles. In the first row after the rib, increase 0/1/0/1/1/0/0/ 0/1 st. You will have a total of 31/32/33/34/36/37/39/41/42 st. Every 2,5/2,5/3/3/3/3/3/3/3 cm, increase 1 st on both sides until you have 45/48/49/52/54/57/61/65/68 st. Continue working until you have a total height of 24,5/27/29/31/33/35,5/38,5/41,5/44,5 cm. End with a k row.

10

For the sleeve cap, decrease 4 st on both sides at the start of the row. You will have 37/40/41/44/46/49/53/57/60 st.

11

Starting from this point, decrease each time at the front of the garment as follows (raglan):

Row 1: 2 st k, slip the 3rd st without knitting, work the 4th st k, bring the 3rd st over the 4th. Purl until 4 st from the end, then 2 st k together, and then 2 st k.

Row 2: 3 st p, then knit until 3 st from the end, then 2 st p.

Row 3: 3 st k, then purl until 3 st from the end, then 3 st k.

Row 4 = row 2.

Work these 4 rows a total of 3/3/3/3/4/4/4/4/5 times. Then work rows 1 and 2 a total of 5/6/7/8/7/8/9/10/9 times. Repeat row 1 one more time. Keep 19/20/19/20/22/23/25/27/30 leftover st.

12

In the return row, decrease 10/10/9/10/10/11/12/13/15 st. Turn your piece and continue the decrease from row 1, but only at the start of the row. Finish the row. In the return row, decrease 4/5/5/5/6/6/6/7/8 st. Turn your piece and continue the decrease from row 1, but only at the start of the row. Finish the row. In the return row, decrease 2/2/2/2/3/3/4/4/4 st. Turn your piece and bind off the last stitch.

Knit the second sleeve in a mirror image.

Collar

13

Sew the raglan part of the sleeves to the front and the back pieces using a mattress stitch.

14

Slide the st for the back piece onto a no. 4.5 circular knitting needle. Pick up knit st along the sleeve cap, the front, and the other sleeve cap until you have 76/80/80/82/88/92/94/98/102 st. Work 2.5 cm of 1x1 rib stitch. Purl one row. Continue using 1x1 rib stitch for another 2.5 cm. Knit 1 row using cotton thread and loosely bind off.

15

Fold the collar over and attach every st for the collar (right under the cotton thread) to the bottom of the collar using a straight stitch. Cut and remove the cotton thread once you have sewn all the way around the collar.

Embroider the animal

16

Draw the desired animal onto the stabilizer. Use a straight stitch to embroider the animal head onto the sweater. Moisten the stabilizer.

TIP

Don't have any water-soluble stabilizer? Then use some pattern paper and gently tear it away once your embroidery is done.

17

Sew the raglan part of the sleeves to the front and the back pieces using a mattress stitch. Tuck away all the loose threads and allow to rest under a damp towel overnight.
