




Violet is a knee-length, loose dress with a V-neck and short sleeves. The drawstring is perfect for emphasising your waist.



Chest (CS): measure horizontally around the fullest part of the chest.

Hip (H): measure horizontally around the widest part of the lower body.

measurements (in cm)



Compare the stated lengths to the measured or desired lengths. **Lengthen** or **shorten** the dress and/or the sleeves by cutting the pattern pieces at the indicated double lines and then spreading the pattern pieces out X cm from each other or overlapping them where needed. Make sure that the CF and CB lines and the side seams are always straight.


fabric advice



The Violet dress can be made in all kinds of fabric: from woven fabric (crepe, jacquard, satin, ...) to knit fabrics (Ponte Roma, interlock, etc.) Be sure to choose a medium-weight fabric with a fluid drape. pattern pieces & seam allowances (in cm)

To sew the garment as described in the instructions, you must draw the illustrated seam allowances around the paper pattern pieces before cutting them out.



Indicate crucial points on the outline of the pattern:

- Nick the pattern paper and fabric at the places where a single vertical line (I) and double vertical lines (II) are indicated.
- Cut a notch out of the fabric at the V symbol.
- Cut a small corner (notch) out of the pieces that lie on the fabric fold to mark the middle of these pieces, except for pieces 1 and 5.

Mark where the point marked with a (◇) on piece 1 using needle and thread.

sewing instructions



The method used to finish sewing the garment depends on the fabric used.
The pieces are always sewn together with the right sides of the fabric matching exactly, unless stated otherwise.







Pin and sew the shoulder pieces (4) to the top of the front, matching the markings exactly.




Finish both raw edges together using an overlock stitch.



Pin and sew the other side of the shoulder pieces to the top of the back (2), matching the markings exactly.




Finish both raw edges together using an overlock stitch.




Finish the short sides of the front facing (5) and the back facing (6) using an overlock stitch.




Pin and sew the short sides to each other and press the seams open.




Finish the contours of the facing all the way around using an overlock stitch.




Pin the facing to the neckline. The shoulder seams of the facing should line up with the nicks in the shoulder piece. Start with the CB and sew in place up to the basting thread at the CF. Leave the needle there in the fabric. Raise the presser foot, turn the fabric and continue sewing up to the CB.



Snip into the fabric through both seam allowances until just before the basting thread.




Fold the facing and the seam allowance underneath away to the side. Stitch the facing at 2 mm from the seam, sewing through all layers (= the facing + the seam allowance underneath).




Pin and sew the top of the sleeve (3) (= the sleeve cap) to the armhole with the corresponding nicks matching exactly. The single sleeve nick matches the single front nick, the double sleeve nick lines up with the double nick on the back. The top single sleeve nick corresponds with the shoulder piece.



Pin and sew in place.




Finish both raw edges together using an overlock stitch.

Pin and sew the side and underarm seams of the front and back.




Finish the raw edges together using an overlock stitch.




Finish the hem and the hems of the sleeves using an overlock stitch.




Press the seam allowance up to the V notches and sew in place along the edge.


Press the belt (7) in half lengthwise and sew the 3 sides, but leave an opening so that the belt can be turned right side out again.



Turn inside out, press neatly and sew the opening closed.
