The triangular insert (godet) at the front is an eye-catcher although the two-in-one balloon sleeves - with a shorter inner sleeve that pulls the outer sleeve in - do give them a run for their money. Gabby's got some drama going on, but is still wonderfully simple somehow. Some people have just got *it*. No more drama? Drop the godet - simple as that.



Compare the stated lengths to the measured or desired lengths. Lengthen or shorten the dress and/or the sleeves by cutting the pattern pieces at the indicated double lines. Then either increase the distance between the cut pieces by the desired amount (to lengthen) or overlap the pieces (to shorten). Make sure that the CF and CB lines and the side seams are always straight.




pattern pieces & seam allowances (in inches)

To sew the garment as described in the instructions, draw the illustrated seam allowances around the paper pattern pieces before cutting them out. If you are using a PDF pattern, the pattern can be printed with or without seam allowance. To find out more, watch the <u>video</u>.

- 1. front: 2x
- 2. back: 1x on fabric fold
- 3. insert: 1x on fabric fold
- 4. sleeve: 2x
- 5. inner sleeve: 2x

- 6. pocket: 4x
- 7. facing front: 1x on fabric fold
- 8. facing back: 1x on fabric fold







Would you prefer to make Gabby without the insert? Simply omit pattern piece 3 and cut pattern piece 1 once on the fold (remove the ³/₈" of seam allowance from the centre front before you cut). Skip step 2 of the sewing instructions.





sewing instructions



The method used to finish the seams depends on the fabric used. The pieces are always sewn together with the right sides of the fabric facing, unless stated otherwise.







Fold over the top part of the front (1) right sides together and match the dart notches in the side seam. Stitch the dart in a slightly curved line towards the marking thread. Stitch up to and just past the marking thread, so that you've sewn past the fabric. Snip the threads and tie a knot.

Turn the front over so that the wrong side is facing up.

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
Pin and sew the insert (3) to one of the front pieces, stitching from the marking thread to the hem. Press the seam allowance towards the front.


Pin and sew the other side of the insert to the other front piece, keeping the seam allowance of the previous stitching out of the way. Once again, sew from the marking thread to the hem. Press the seam allowance towards the front.


Pin and sew the CF seam from the neckline to the marking thread. Fold the seam allowance of the insert out of the way for this part. Press the seam allowance open.

Snip off the triangular part of the seam allowance of the insert above the marking thread. Finish with overlocking.


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

Finish the indicated edges from neckline to hem in one go with an overlock stitch. Above the marking thread, you only finish the raw edges of a single layer of fabric, while below the marking thread, you finish the raw edges of the front and insert together with an overlock stitch.

Match the single notches and sew into place with a 4" vertical line.




Press the pleat allowance flat so that the V notch lines up evenly with the single notches.

Sew the pleat allowance into place right next to the edge.



Pin and sew the shoulder seams together.




Finish the raw edges with overlock stitching. Press the seam allowance towards the front.

Pin and sew the shoulder seams of the front facing (7) and back facing (8) together.




Finish the raw edges with overlock stitching. Press the seam allowance towards the back facing.


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Finish the outer edge of the facing where indicated with overlock stitching.


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Pin the facing to the dress neckline, right sides together, and sew.




Snip into the seam allowance at the apex of the V until just before the marking thread. This enables the facing to lie flat later on.




Fold the facing and seam allowance over and sew the facing to the seam allowance underneath, right next to the seam.

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


Press the facing neatly to the wrong side. Secure the facing to the CF and shoulder seams by hand with just a few stitches.





Finish the sides of the front and back and the straight ends of the pocket (6) with overlock stitching.



Pin the straight ends of 2 of the 4 pocket pieces to the front with the marking threads matching, right sides together. Sew into place between the marking threads.


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Fold the pocket and seam allowance over and sew the pocket to the seam allowance underneath between the marking threads (= understitch).


Pin the straight ends of the 2 remaining pocket pieces to the back, matching the marking threads. Sew into place between the marking threads. Do not understitch.

Pin and sew the side seams from the underarm down to the marking threads that mark the top of the pocket opening. Now, sew from the next marking thread to the hem. Press the seam allowance open.




Pin and sew the contours of the pocket pieces together at 5% ".

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
Finish the raw edges with overlock stitching.





Fold the sleeve (4) in half with the right sides of the fabric facing and sew the sides together. Press the seam allowance open.




Using a long stitch length at a low thread tension, sew two lines of parallel stitching at the top of the sleeve until just past the indicated single notches. Leave a length of thread at the start and end of the stitching.




Sew two parallel lines at the bottom of the sleeve using a long stitch at a low thread tension. Leave a length of thread at the start and end of the stitching.

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



Fold the inner sleeve (5) in half with the right sides of the fabric touching and sew the straight sides together. Press the seam allowance open.



Slide the inner sleeve into the outer sleeve, so that the hemlines are aligned, and the right sides are touching.

Now, carefully tug the ends of the outer sleeve hem's gathering threads to gather the fabric. Distribute the gathers until the notches in both sleeves match.







Pin and sew into place.

Remove the gathering threads.

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
Turn the right way out so that the right sides of the sleeve are visible.




Carefully tug the ends of the gathering threads at the top of the sleeve to gather the fabric. Distribute the gathers until the notches in both sleeves match.

Pin and sew the top of both sleeves to the armhole, matching the notches. The single notch marks the front, while the double notch marks the back. The single notch at the top aligns with the shoulder seam.

Remove the gathering threads.



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Press the hem allowance over at the V notches.

Open back out.

Match the raw edge to the pressed fold line.

Fold over again.

Sew the hem allowance into place right next to the edge.
